It was as simple as eliminating my stateside expenses and applying a portion of the difference to my travels

Expense	Amount Per Month	Reduced To
Car Insurance	\$200	\$0 - put on hold indefinitely
Rent	\$1200	\$30 - storage unit
Gasoline	\$200	\$0 - no need
Internet/cable	\$100	\$0 - cancelled
Food	\$400	\$0 - no groceries
Electric/gas/water	\$150	\$5 - minimum charge
Cell Phone	\$90	\$5 - 'on hold' plan

I took \$2,190 dollar in monthly expenses and reduce them to \$40 dollars.

I know what you're thinking: "Sure, that's all good and well, but how did you actually MAKE money? And how did you cover your expenses, buddy? Hello!?"

You'd be right in thinking those things. So let me tell you how it actually worked out.

My \$1200 dollar rent breaks down to \$40 dollars per day (divide 30). As long as I spent less than \$40 dollars per day, on average, for lodging, I'd be reducing my expenses.

Before you scoff and think "Who wants to stay in a dump of a hotel for \$40 dollars?!"

Why don't you take a look at the place I stayed in for \$15 dollars per night and let me know if you still think that:



Those are unadulterated pictures all taken within about 100 feet of each other.

So, now I'm gaining \$25 dollars a day on my regular lodging expenses to stay in paradise. If I were to go back, I'd gain even more because of the improved currency difference.

That spot is my little gem and you can find places like this very easily.

To give you an idea about how much some of the other expense cost: a massive plate of incredible local cuisine: \$1.50 USD. Full tank of gas: \$3 USD. Vehicle rental: \$150/month. Internet: \$0.80 cents per hour. Cable: free. Gas/Water/Electric: free. Cell phone: Chose not to get one.

Are you starting to see how possible this is? I sure hope so, because it'd be a shame to miss out on experiences like that one because you think you can't afford it.

Great, but how did you make your money?

ASIA

Country	Daily Expense for Two	Hi-lights
Thailand	\$15-\$75	\$5 dollar massages, gorgeous beaches, elephant rides, incredible temples, custom tailored clothing, fantastic markets and shopping. Amazing boat cruises. Rock climbing. Rafting. Great food.
Vietnam	\$25-\$90	Fantastic, safe group travel. Delicious food. Incredible views and geology. Snorkling and windsurfing. Get several outfits or suits custom tailored for under \$200. All-day boat cruises with wine.
India	\$10-\$50	This is the ultimate budget destination. Travelers either fall in love with India or hate it. It is an undeniably gorgeous place. See the Taj Mahal. Stuff yourself silly with Indian cuisine. Take a camel safari, visit the Himilaya by raft, souvenir shopping, incredible service.

AFRICA & MIDDLE EAST

Country	Daily Expense for Two	Hi-lights
Morocco	\$30-\$100	Camel trek the desert, hike and raft. Snowski and snowboard (really!). Wind-surf. Be prepared for a language and culture barrier. Amazing golf courses for \$10-\$20 dollars. Great markets.
Egypt	\$20-\$80	Fantastic & safe group travel. See the pyramids & sphinx. Buy luxury perfumes and clothes for cheap. Explore historical sites & great museums. Sail the Nile.
Jordan	\$35-\$100	An amazing cross blend of Roman, Turkish, and Middle-eastern culture. See the dead sea, explore great canyons, go scuba diving and snorkling. Experience delicious cuisine. Visit Petra, miles and miles of monuments, buildings and tombs.

EUROPE

Country	Daily Expense for Two	Hi-lights
Turkey	\$30-\$100	Pristine beaches and sailing. Explore Istanbul, the odd caves and formations of Cappadocia, relax in Turkish baths, enjoy Turkish hookah and wine or beer. Ski for less than \$10 dollars a day.
Spain	\$40-\$300	More expensive than others, but an amazingly fun place. Party in Ibiza. Practice your Spanish. Beaches, countrysides, wine, food, culture.
Romania	\$25-\$250	Visit the Black Sea and Transylvania region. Explore the 'birthplace' of Dracula. Ski and snowboard the alps. Hike gorgeous trails. Buy exquisite wine bottles for \$4. Explore medieval castles and churches.

North America

Country	Daily Expense for Two	Hi-lights
Costa Rica	\$20-\$150	Zipline through cloud forests, sit in a thermal spa as a volcano erupts in the distance, surf on the world's most beautiful beaches, explore jungles and wildlife. Highly recommended.
Guatemala	\$20-\$100	Explore Mayan ruins. Tour coffee plantations. Take day-journeys to Belize and Honduras. Get scuba certified for \$200. Go rafting and biking through jungles. Enjoy \$1 cocktails.
United States	\$45-\$400	Most reading this will be from the USA, but there are SO many incredible things do in the US that it can't go without mention. See majestic Yosemite. Visit thriving New York City. Mt. Rushmore. Country dance in Austin. Get crazy in Vegas.

South America

Country	Daily Expense for Two	Hi-lights
Bolivia	\$20-\$80	Enjoy dramatic views of lake Titicaca, volcanoes, fun people, ambitious climbing, jungles and wildlife galore, explore indigenous hill tribes. Great skiing.
Argentina	\$25-\$100	The best of European culture at 1/3 the price. In South America? Yep. Buenos Aires is one of the world's best-rated cities. Tango with locals, enjoy nightlife, shopping, go to a cowboy ranch, visit Patagonia, dinosaur remains, lakes, waterfalls, and beaches. Great quality for the prices.
Peru	\$10-\$50	Explore legendary Maccu Pichu, hike the Inca trail. Visit the sacred valley, mountain bike, see or trek the Andes, enjoy peruvian wine and beer, great shopping.

Oceania

Country	Daily Expense for Two	Hi-lights
New Zealand	\$35-150	Enjoy fabulous wine, raft off a waterfall, see glow-worm caves, swim with dolphins, take a boat cruise of incredible Milford Sound. Enjoy beaches of Abel Tasman National Park.
Indonesia	\$25-\$90	Island hop tropical beaches. See Komodo dragons, visit volcano crater lakes, explore great variety of cultures and architecture. Great marine and bird life. Great dance performers. Cool shopping.
Australia	\$40-\$150	See the Sydney Opera House, Kangaroos, the Blue mountains, and the Great barrier Reef. Visit the bush, surf with locals, people watch, take a journey to Ayers Rock and explore the epic Western coast.

Antarctica

Country	Daily Expense for Two	Hi-lights
No countries	\$100-\$1000	See amazing, melting icebergs, penguins, polar bears, gorgeous mountains, and try hard to stay warm!

Getting There

Admittedly, one of the biggest expenses you will encounter will be the airfare to some of these locations. While places like Costa Rica and Bolivia can be quite cheap to fly to, many of the places seem prohibitively expensive at first glance.

Here are 3 tips to help you get deals on flights:

Cheap Airfare Tip #1: Get a Frequent Flyer Credit Card



If you get a card that has a frequent flyer program connected to a world airline alliance, you can use your 'miles' on ANY airline within the alliance. In addition, you usually get a free flight with your first purchase.

So, the trick is to use your free flight to fly to a major US city's airport like LA, Houston, Chicago, or New York. You then search for your international flights from those cities, which can be as cheap as a few hundred dollars.

The other great thing about the credit card is that if you put your regular expenses at home on the card, you will quickly get enough miles to exchange for a flight on the international network.

Cheap Airfare Tip #2: Use Kayak.com's "Fare Finder" and "Cheap Destinations" Tools



Go to Kayak.com and enter a flight from your hometown to where you want to go. You will see an option that will allow you to search for fares on flights over the course of the entire year. Using this tool and the 'matrix view,' you can easily find the best time of year to travel.

In addition, you can sign up to get daily/weekly/monthly alerts on the cheapest prices for the top 25 cities per continent. This one tip alone can save you hundreds of dollars the next time you travel.

Cheap Airfare Tip #3: Get Cheap Fare and Last-Minute Alerts From Home



Sign up for the fare alerts from TravelZoo and Sherman's Travel. You will now get alerts for the cheapest fares from your hometown and you will get alerts about last-minute cheap fares.
